Criteria for Membership

“An active member shall be a woman who is employed as a professional educator or has been retired from an educational position. An active member shall participate in the activities of the Society”. Prospective members can be invited by a current member to attend a chapter meeting as a guest, providing an opportunity to learn more about The Society and its programs. Membership is by invitation only.

Mu Chapter makes a difference in the community; we participate in several yearly projects, for example:

- Annual grant-in-aid to an Education Major student from Barton College or Wesleyan College
- Christmas boxes for students in need
- Singing at local nursing homes
- Give “pick me up” bags to student teachers
- Supporting Beginning Teachers within local school system



Schools for Africa became the Society's first official international project in 2010. Currently the project works with 13 countries in sub-Saharan Africa. The SFA mission involves providing access to quality basic education for children, focusing on girls, orphans, and other vulnerable youngsters. UNICEF works through this project with governments, local authorities, communities, and other partners.

Supporting Early-career Educators (SEE) became the second international project during the 2012 International Convention in New York City. The Educational Excellence Committee established SEE to support, provide guidance and help beginning teachers in the community.

On average Mu Chapter meets five times a year with a program or project at each meeting. We have at least four business meetings. We have one Tri-Chapter meeting each spring, at which three area chapters meet. NC State has one convention each year; DKG International has one every other year, and each Region usually has a conference every other year.
